Sustainable Bamboo Forestry

Bamboo is incredibly fast growing. Lignification - the hardening of the bamboo stem takes place within 2-3 years during the development phase, and the bamboo stem is mature and ready to harvest after just 5 years. This means that 20% of a bamboo forest can be harvested annually, ensuring sustainable forestry. By harvesting the mature plants, the yield and quality of the bamboo forest actually increases!
